CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

Enters his first season in the NLL and first with the expansion-era Knighthawks ... Notched his first hat trick in the 16-7 win at Albany on 12/18 ... Scored his first two pro goals and made his pro debut in the 13-12 overtime win at New York on 12/04 ... A three-time NCAA champion at both the Division I and Division II level ... Completed his fifth year of collegiate lacrosse as a transfer graduate student at the University of Virginia in 2021 ... Appeared in all 18 games with the Cavaliers, scoring 26 goals and adding seven assists for 33 points while leading Virginia to its second straight NCAA National Championship ... His NCAA collegiate record 65-game goal-scoring streak was snapped in the 14-12 win over Robert Morris back on March 20, marking one of only four games all season he failed to score a goal ... Played four seasons at Merrimack College, where he was one of the most decorated players in program history. A three-time 50-goal scorer, Bertrand totaled 274 points — including 210 goals — in 58 career games while leading the Warriors to back-to-back NCAA Division II National Championships in 2018 and 2019 ... Also a three-time USILA All-American, including a two-time First Team selection in 2018 and 2019 after combining for a team-leading 140 goals and 176 points over those two years ... He garnered Second Team honors as a rookie in 2017 ... A former two-year captain was twice named a USILA National Player of the Year and USILA Top Attackman in consecutive seasons (2018-19), winning the former award outright as a junior after sharing it as a sophomore, which marked the program's first such honoree in five seasons ... Additional accolades include being named the NEILA New England Player of the Year in 2019, NE10 Rookie of the Year in 2017 and the only Division II player to be twice named to the Tewaaraton Watch List in 2019 and 2020 ... He was also named the Male Athlete of the Year as a senior for Baldwinsville high school, where he was a two-time team MVP and captain in both hockey and lacrosse ... Played with Redwoods of the Premier Lacrosse League during the summer of 2021, leading all team rookies with eight points in six games, including one two-point goal

Entering his ninth NLL season and first with the expansion-era Knighthawks ... Recorded his first two points as a Knighthawk with a pair of assists against Georgia on 1/21 ... Made his Knighthawks debut at New York on 12/04 ... Acquired by the Georgia Swarm on July 6, 2020, but was unable to appear in a game following the cancellation of the 2020-21 NLL season due to the COVID-19 pandemic ... He previously spent nine seasons with the Colorado Mammoth, during which he compiled 75 points (15+60), 492 loose ball recoveries and 139 caused turnovers in 128 career games ... His 64 loose ball recoveries ranked second on the team, while his six points (2+4) ranked second-most by a defenseman ... Named Teammate of the Year at the conclusion of the 2019-20 season ...
